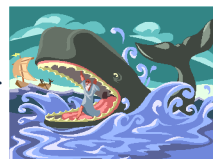

**Just Thinking --** We might not want to admit it, but sometimes comedy gives us a vital lesson in real life. There is a comedian on TV that goes around shouting, "Git 'er done!". We may laugh at some of his comedy, but if you think about it, God has been telling us this from the very beginning.

God created the heavens and earth, animals and fish, plants and seas; even snakes and mosquitoes. The Bible tells us he then made man and woman. He gave them dominion or control over all things (Gen 1:26), in effect he told Adam and Eve to "Git 'er done!"; but as we know, they didn't.



God told Moses to "Git 'er done!", but he doubted and never reached the Promised Land. He told Jonah to "Git 'er done!" and to go hold a revival in Nineveh, but he ended up in the belly of a large fish. He told the children of Israel to "Get 'er done!" and they ended up in captivity.

There are those that still have not claimed the promise that Jesus made, "If we ask any thing according to His will, He heareth us: and if we know that He hears us, whatsoever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we desired of Him." (1 John 5:14-15 KJV)

You've got to have faith and believe to claim this promise and then you can "Git 'er done!" according to God's will.

The Nazarene church had a small congregation of very faithful people; all but one brother who had quit coming to church.

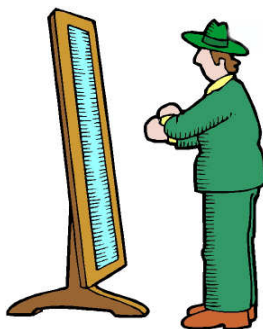
