Haynes Shares New Adventure

The Haynes are about to move to Swaziland, an independent country, surrounded by the Republic of South Africa. It was the site of the first Nazarene work on the continent of Africa.

Jimmy and Brenda will be Work and Witness Coordinators for the newly formed Southern Africa Nazarene University.

The Haynes who live in the Greer area have been actively involved in Work and Witness with the South Carolina District for many years and were invited to take on this new task, which will require an extended stay in Swaziland.

Just Thinking -- We have been watching, as they remodeled and renamed one of our favorite restaurants for what seemed like months. It is a Japanese restaurant, where we would often go for hibachi and sushi (no we don't eat the raw stuff or as one comedian put it, "We don't eat bait".); but it has good service, good food, and it is clean. Even more important, it is usually quiet.

When we were in there the other day for lunch, they had just reopened and had a new menu. Many of the items had their Japanese names with an English description. When the waitress came, I told her we wanted "T-5" and pointed to it on the menu. She said, "Oh, you mean..." I'm not sure what she said; but, to me, it sounded like, "You got cooties".



There's something that I learned when we had the Korean ministry at the church; while I can speak some of three different languages, this Southern boy's tongue just can't handle Oriental dialect, even though I tried.

That may have been what it was like on Pentecost when the apostles spoke. With all of the languages there, many of those folks expected to hear some strange sounds from those Galileans. Yet, they heard in their native languages and understood. The Bible says, "They were completely amazed at this. They said, "Look! Aren't all these people that we hear speaking from Galilee? Then how is it possible that we each hear them in our own languages? We are from different places: Parthia, Media, Elam, Mesopotamia, Judea, Cappadocia, Pontus, Asia, Phrygia, Pamphylia, Egypt, the areas of Libya near Cyrene, Rom¹ (both Jews and those who had become Jews), Crete, and Arabia. But we hear them telling in our own languages about the great things God has done!" (Acts 2:7-11 NCV) They expected confusion, but God did away with the confusion and they were "completely amazed." "Ain't God great?"

Well, the "You got cooties" was really good and we will be going back. See you in Church, Sunday School, and Family Camp.
