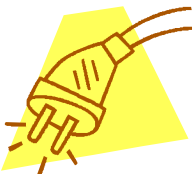

Just Thinking -- Many years ago, it seems like in another lifetime, I was in the Navy. My grandkids might want to ask, "Our navy?" They may even ask, "Were the ships made of wood with sails?"
